
K-3 Newsletter

Dear Parents,

As your child begins their potty training journey, we want to partner with you to make this milestone a positive and successful experience. Potty training is an important step in developing independence and confidence, and consistency between home and school plays a key role in your child's success.

Clothing for Success

Please send your child to school in clothing that allows them to use the restroom as independently as possible. Elastic waistbands, simple pull-up shorts or pants, and easy-to-remove bottoms are ideal. Avoid clothing with snaps, buttons, belts, overalls, or rompers during this stage, as these can delay your child when they recognize the urge to go.

Training Supplies

At the beginning of this process, accidents are expected and part of learning. Please ensure your child has:

- 5–6 pairs of training underwear or pull-ups
- 3 pairs of pants or shorts
- 3 pairs of socks
- 1 extra pair of shoes
- A labeled wet bag or plastic bag for soiled clothing

We will change your child promptly after any accident and always treat them with kindness and respect. Clothing that becomes soiled will be placed in a sealed bag and sent home each day. Following health and safety standards, we do not rinse or wash clothing at school.

Our Approach

Our teachers use positive reinforcement, gentle reminders, and child-led readiness cues. We encourage children to try the potty at regular intervals, but we never force or shame them. Readiness signs may include:

- · Showing interest in the toilet or wanting to wear underwear
- Staying dry for longer periods
- · Communicating when they need to go
- Being able to pull pants up and down independently

Once your child experiences consistent success, we'll collaborate with you to transition from training underwear to regular underwear.

Partnership Between Home and School

Consistency is key. We encourage families to continue potty routines at home, celebrate small victories, and use encouraging language. Remember that every child learns at their own pace — and patience and positivity go a long way.
